HOMework & GRADING

Language Arts

Homework will be assigned as needed to reinforce skills taught in class. Grades will be figured as follows: 10% Word Study, 30% Practice, 60% Assessments/Quizzes/Projects

Social Studies & Science

Homework will be assigned periodically to reinforce skills taught in class. Grades will be figured as follows: 30% Practice/Homework, 70% Assessments/Quizzes/Projects

Math

Students will be given approximately 4 tests each trimester. Homework will be assigned each night. Grades will be figured as follows: 10% Homework, 30% Quizzes, 60% Tests

Homework Policy

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

K.O.R.T. stands for "Knights of the Round Table." During KORT, students in grades 5,6,7, & 8 listen to announcements, set reading goals, have reading time, and participate in Character Education lessons as well as community building activities.

Language Arts coursework includes word study, reading strategies, and writing, which are directly aligned with the MN state standards. The reading curriculum is a combination of Interactive Reading Notebook work, short stories, and novels.

Social Studies students will immerse themselves in American History from Ancient Americans to Western Expansion. Topics include: Native Americans, Explorers, The Thirteen colonies, and the Revolutionary War.

Math curriculum is aligned to the MN state standards. Topics include Number Theory, Estimation and Computation, Geometry, Fractions, Decimals and Percents, Addition and Subtraction of Fractions, Coordinates, Area, Volume, and Algebraic Concepts and Skills.

Science includes a variety of topics aligned with the MN state standards. Studies include, but are not limited to, the exploration of engineering concepts, physical, life, and earth sciences.

Art students will study the Elements and Principles of Art. Students will learn Line, Shape, Value, Space, Form, Texture, and Color while creating an assortment of artwork. A diverse group of artists from around the world and art styles will also be explored.

General Music is where students learn the elements of music and music theory. They apply what they learn through quizzes, tests, and the composing and mixing program Garage Band.

Physical Education students do not change clothes for class. They need to have clean, dry shoes appropriate for the gym floors. Students will learn various skills for team and individual sports.

Band is a year-long Responsive Hour course where students learn the basics of their chosen band instrument through small group lessons and full group settings. We have two concerts per year. Students will need an instrument 1st trimester for lessons.

Choir is a year-long Responsive Hour course where students learn basic choral skills, vocal development, and music theory. We have three concerts per year.
